		Betsy shared that her husband was able to play Santa this past weekend at the Grass Valley Holiday Market and that her daughter was a great supporter of the vendors as well. Betsy also shared that the devastating fire at the BIOPHARMA Hemp Plant in Grass Valley is going to have significant impacts on the community and that already the GV Market is seeing an impact and there is concern in the community about how the fire will impact the community and those families that were making a good wage.
		It was mentioned that we should reach out to Business Oregon to connect them with GV Market, Brad mentioned that Grocery stores and markets are part of the critical infrastructure in rural communities and there is likely emergency funds that can assist the community during this time.



		K'Lynn will follow up with Sherman Co. Court to share the benefits of the GC Grant Program. And check their interest in creating something similar especially in times of crisis such as the Hemp Fire.
