Gilliam Co. Small Business Grant	Requested \$107,505.00 Funded \$62,505.00 Remaining \$44,995.00 Hoping to request additional grant funds from the County at the May meeting.
Ford Family Foundation	Approved/Funded in full \$25,000, thankful for the support of Pioneer Community Development.
Sponsorship Opportunity - Big River Band Festival	\$5,000 sponsorship of the Big River Festival was discussed, the board would like to see more information on what the Chamber will get from providing a sponsorship. The board agrees to a \$3,500 reimbursement post event; motion was made by Greg Price, seconded by Diana. Motion passed unanimously.
